Affordable Care Act Consumer Assistance Resources by State/Territory for State and Local Partners

How do I use this guide?

This document serves as a guide for state and local partners to refer individuals and organizations to resources for education and enrollment in the Health Insurance Marketplace and for partnership opportunities. Refer to your state/territory's section for details about the following resources:

Health Insurance Marketplace Website – Every Health Insurance Marketplace has an online portal where you can find information about health insurance plans and apply online for coverage.

Health Insurance Marketplace Call Center – Every Health Insurance Marketplace has a toll-free Call Center that you can call for information about health insurance plans and to apply over the phone.

Navigators – Every state will have a Navigator program required to conduct public education to raise awareness about the availability of qualified health plans (QHPs); distribute fair and impartial information; facilitate enrollment into QHPs; provide referrals to the appropriate entity or agency for consumers with a grievance, question or complaint; and provide information that is culturally and linguistically appropriate to meet the needs of the population being served by the Marketplace. Individuals and organizations have been selected and funded through a grant process to serve as Navigators. State/local partners can refer individuals/organizations to Navigators in their states for assistance. State/local partners can also connect AAPI-serving organizations with Navigators for partnership opportunities – some Navigators are partnering or contracting with other organizations to expand their assistance activities – or encourage organizations to apply to serve as Navigators. The state section includes the list of current Navigators (some states haven't selected Navigators yet) and details on service areas and target populations, if specified.

In-Person Assisters – States with state partnership marketplaces (Arkansas, Delaware, Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, New Hampshire, West Virginia) and some states with state-based marketplaces will have in-person assistance personnel in addition to navigators. State/local partners can refer individuals/organizations to in-person assisters (IPAs) for help with education and enrollment. State/local partners can also apply to serve as IPAs and encourage organizations to serve as IPAs.

Certified Application Counselors – Certified application counselors (CACs) are certified by the Marketplace to perform the same functions as navigators and in-person assisters, but do not receive funding from the state or federal government. State/local partners can refer individuals/organizations to CACs for help with education and enrollment. State/local partners can also apply to become CACs and encourage individuals/organizations to become CACs.

Community Health Center Outreach and Enrollment Assistance Grantees – The US Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) awarded \$150 million in grant awards to 1,159 health centers across the nation to enable them to help uninsured Americans gain affordable health insurance coverage.

Community health centers that are Association of Asian Pacific Community Health Organizations (AAPCHO) member agencies are denoted with a *. State/local partners can refer individuals/organizations to these community health centers for help with education and enrollment.

Rural Health Services Outreach Program – Rural health organizations across the country are receiving funding from HHS’ Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) to help people in their communities understand the benefits available to them, eligibility requirements and options in their State Health Insurance Marketplaces. These organizations include universities, local and critical hospitals, and other rural non-profit or public organizations.

Connecting Kids to Coverage Outreach and Enrollment Grantees – HHS awarded \$32 million in grant awards to continue efforts to find and enroll eligible children in Medicaid and the Children’s Health Insurance Program (CHIP) that were initially funded under the Children’s Health Insurance Program Reauthorization Act of 2009 (CHIPRA). State/local partners can refer individuals/organizations to these organizations for education and/or enrollment in Medicaid or CHIP.

How do I search for this information online?

CMS has launched an online “Local Help” function to help locate in person enrollment assistance in the Health Insurance Marketplace. At LocalHelp.healthcare.gov users can input their geographic location to identify local consumer assistance destinations to serve consumers and small businesses.

The information is mobile optimized so it can be easily accessed on tablets and smartphones. The data behind the Local Help tool consists of many Navigator grantees, Certified Application counselors, state Medicaid and CHIP agencies and others who are trained to provide in person assistance to consumers and small businesses. As many organizations are still completing the training and certification process the database will be regularly updated to add new locations as they become available.

AMERICAN SAMOA

Territories and the ACA

Under the Affordable Care Act, U.S. territories had until October 1, 2013 to establish a health insurance Marketplace and be treated as a state for the purposes of the Marketplace. After October 1, territories will not be able to elect to establish a Marketplace. The federal government will not operate a federally facilitated Exchange in the territories that don't set up their own. A territory that doesn't set up a Marketplace will get an increase in funding for their Medicaid program. The individual and employer coverage mandates do not apply to the territories.

Under the Affordable Care Act, U.S. territories had until October 1, 2013 to establish a health insurance Marketplace and be treated as a state for the purposes of the Marketplace. After October 1, territories will not be able to elect to establish a Marketplace. The federal government will not operate a federally facilitated Exchange in the territories that don't set up their own. A territory that doesn't set up a Marketplace will get an increase in funding for their Medicaid program. The individual and employer coverage mandates do not apply to the territories.

Under the Affordable Care Act, U.S. territories had until October 1, 2013 to establish a health insurance Marketplace and be treated as a state for the purposes of the Marketplace. After October 1, territories will not be able to elect to establish a Marketplace. The federal government will not operate a federally facilitated Exchange in the territories that don't set up their own. A territory that doesn't set up a Marketplace will get an increase in funding for their Medicaid program. The individual and employer coverage mandates do not apply to the territories.

A territory that doesn't set up a Marketplace will get an increase in funding for their Medicaid program. The individual and employer coverage mandates do not apply to the territories.
