


What Is Human Trafficking?

- Modern-day slavery
- Occurs in U.S. and across the globe
- Involves force, fraud or coercion
- Two major categories:
 - Sex trafficking (commercial sex)
 - Labor trafficking (forced labor, debt bondage)



What Is Human Trafficking?



Victim Certification

- HHS Certification allows a foreign trafficking victim in the United States to access public benefits and services ***to the same extent as a refugee***



ORR Victim Assistance Grants

- Service provider network across U.S.
- Case management for pre-certified and certified victims and some family members
- Region 6 provider:
 - U.S. Committee for Refugees and Immigrants (USCRI)

Children who are exploited and forced to live as migrant workers, domestic servants or prostitutes are victims of human trafficking.

R&R Regional Grantees

- Intensify local outreach, victim ID/service
- Bring more advocates, service providers into *R&R* anti-trafficking movement
- Train local network of sub-awardees
