
in the President’s Interfaith and Community Service Campus Challenge 2014/2015

President Obama’s Interfaith and Community Service Campus Challenge invites institutions of higher education to initiate or expand opportunities for students to participate in community service that includes interfaith engagement.

The program has experienced steady growth since President Obama issued the Challenge in 2011, when 276 institutions signed up. 367 schools are currently enrolled in the Challenge. 81 schools that signed up in the past no longer provide information about the person who leads their interfaith/community service work. About 50 additional schools were represented at the Fourth Annual Interfaith and Community Service Campus Challenge held in September 2014. [So, more than 500 schools have been or are actively involved.](#)

12% of the schools in the IPED database with 1,000 or more students participate in the President’s Campus Challenge.

There are participating schools in 43 states, American Samoa, the US Virgin Islands, and the District of Columbia.



Participating institutions include:

20	Historically Black Colleges and Universities
2	Tribal Colleges
35	With 20 or more percent Hispanic students
3	Private for-profit, 2-year
36	Public, 2-year
6	Private for-profit, 4-year or above
231	Private not-for-profit, 4-year or above
90	Public, 4-year or above


Total enrollment in participating schools is over 3 million students. This is **14% of all college students**

All together there are about 3,810 students classified as nonresident aliens who attend participating schools.

Students who attend schools that participate in the Challenge

Category	Percent
Community Colleges Students	6
Private 4-year or above colleges and universities students [*]	26
Public 4-year or above colleges and universities students	21

*For example, this means one in every four students who attend private 4-year colleges and universities are attending an institution that participates in the President's Campus Challenge.
