## Major Changes Since Version 2.1 (June 2017)

### Data file

Improved accuracy of metrics for six-digit OPEIDs that consist of more than 1 IPEDS UNITID by **using the metric-specific denominators as the weight** in creating weighted averages (vs. using the undergraduate degree-seeking student count for all metrics)

**Changed aggregation from UNITID to six-digit OPEID for the percent Pell and percent federal borrowers** metrics to use the median share of Pell students (federal borrowers) across the campuses sharing a six-digit OPEID.

Scorecard changed its calculation of **percent of entering class that are first-time, full-time students** to be able to include more institutions; this file still pulls the data from Scorecard directly.

**Institutions with no branches operating** as of October 5, 2018 (based on the Scorecard currently operating flag CURROPER) were **excluded** from the calculations in this file. **All branches from institutions with at least one branch in operation** as of October 5, 2018 (based on the Scorecard currently operating flag CURROPER) were **included** in these calculations.

**Updated College Scorecard data elements** to use data published on technical site in October 2018

**Added completion and transfer rate data 8 years after entering** the institutions for all entering students (full- *and* part-time; first-time *and* transfer-in)

**Updated FSA data-based metrics** to use the most current data available as of November 2018

In addition, this lower score typically requires that the school be subject to cash monitoring requirements and post a letter of credit (equal to a minimum of 10 percent of the Title IV aid it received in the institution's most recent fiscal year).</p>
<b>90/10 Revenue Percentage</b>	<p>Section 487(d)(4) of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (HEA), as amended, requires the Secretary to annually submit a report to Congress containing information regarding the amount and percentage of each proprietary institution's revenues from Title IV sources and non-Title IV sources as provided by the institution in its audited financial statements. The reports are sent to the Chairmen and Ranking Members of the corresponding House and Senate authorizing committees. Below, you can access the 90/10 transmittal letters, summary charts and reports for institutions with fiscal years ending in the corresponding award year. This information relates to the requirement under the HEA that a for-profit institution of postsecondary education derive at least 10 percent of its revenue from non-Title IV sources (i.e., the 90/10 rule).</p>








LESS THAN 4-YR VS. 4-YR OR HIGHER SCHOOLS BY CONTROL




SCHOOLS BY GRADUATION RATE




SCHOOLS BY COHORT DEFAULT RATE




SCHOOLS BY MEDIAN DEBT OF COMPLETERS (\$)




SCHOOLS BY GRADUATION PLUS TRANSFER RATE










LESS THAN 4-YR VS. 4-YR OR HIGHER SCHOOLS BY CONTROL






SCHOOLS BY COHORT DEFAULT RATE




SCHOOLS BY MEDIAN DEBT OF COMPLETERS (\$)














LESS THAN 4-YR VS. 4-YR OR HIGHER SCHOOLS BY CONTROL










